Please enjoy this edition of The Heart and all the information and invitations it contains.




Home Gathering Groups are one of the key fellowship opportunities at St. Luke's to build friendships and community among our parishioners, new and

Help us decorate the church for Easter Sunday!



- 294 Prayer Squares
- 12 Shawls (3 Wedding Shawls)

In the coming months, they plan to partner with the TN-Bradley County Chapter of Sleep in Heavenly Peace to donate youth sized blankets to children in our community in need of beds and bedding. They will also be gifting custom blankets to our graduating high school seniors. And production has begun on blankets for families affected by Hurricane Helene as they begin moving back into their homes.

Each year St. Luke's Episcopal Church offers its graduating high school seniors the opportunity to apply for and receive the C.L. (Buddy) and Jane Patten Scholarship, as part of our commitment to the ongoing growth and success of

the young people of this church. The scholarship is a one time award of up to \$1,200, and has been funded in year's past by donations and memorials made to the church in memory of many faithful members of the parish.

In the eighteen years since the scholarship was founded, fifty-one graduating seniors have received \$51,450 in financial assistance for their college education. Over the next ten years, St. Luke's expects to award *at least* another \$15,000 in scholarships. Memorials and donations to support the Patten Scholarship are always appreciated, and help to ensure the scholarship will be available for years to come.

In Good Company: Women Across the Holy Scriptures and Meaning-Making for Today
Grace Point Camp and Retreat Center, Kingston, Tennessee



Casey Cole Higginbotham leads an honest and courageous examination and celebration of women and their stories from both Testaments and what they might mean for the Church today. Provides historical, theological, and literary insight into biblical women's relationships with each other, with men, and with God.

Sessions include:

- +Three Marys and a Martha: What Jesus' interactions with these women mean for us now.
- +Those Bible Verses: an academic interpretation of the Scriptures most hotly debated for gender relationship in the home, the world, and the church.
- +How to Read the Rough Stuff: a pathos-approach to the 'terrifying texts' about women in the Bible.

Women come away from this time feeling seen, loved, and emboldened, and have a better sense of belonging and curiosity about their faith, church, and Holy Scriptures.
